


WATER RESOURCES PROTECTION ACT

West Virginia Code Chapter 22, Article 26



Requirements of the Act

A Survey of large quantity water users

Creation of a registration program

 Quarterly reports to the Joint Legislative Oversight Commission

Final report by December 31, 2006

Final Report Elements

 The location and quantity of all surface water and all groundwater resources in the state.

- A discussion of consumptive and nonconsumptive water withdrawals.
- A listing of each person whose withdrawal is greater than 750,000 during any calendar month, beginning in 2003.

•A discussion of areas of concern regarding drought or flood may threaten the beneficial use of water.

•Current or potential uses that may exacerbate natural low flow conditions.

 Discussion of a potential groundwater well network to monitor groundwater resources.

 Potential growth areas that may cause competition for a water resource. Any occurrence where two or more withdrawals are, or may, interfere with each other.
A discussion of conservation practices that have been implemented.

Any other information that may be beneficial

 The survey was released on March 31st and is to be completed by July 1st.

 At this time, approximately 430 entities, of the 1600 that were notified, have responded to the survey.

Penalty Rule

 The act provides for a penalty of up to \$5,000 for failure to complete the survey or register, to provide other information as required by the article, or providing false or misleading information.

 WV-DEP promulgated a procedural rule for penalty assessment (60 CSR 6).

Confidentiality Rule

 The act also included provisions for declaring information submitted to the DEP confidential.

 The agency drafted 60 CSR 7, "Confidential Information under Water Resources Protection Act", and will shortly submit the final rule to the Secretary of State's Office.

The Future


 After submission of the final report in 2006, no further action, other than maintaining a registry of large quantity users, is required.

 WV-DEP is to make recommendations to the legislature for further actions, if any, at that time.
